Know an amazing midwife who is making waves in your country? Tell us about them and send a short description of what impact they have made in your country, the name of the midwife and a high quality photo to us at



JUNE 21 - 25




- Celebrate midwives and host an event in your community.

- Hosting the 32nd Triennial Congress in Bali.
- Delivering advocacy workshops.
- Organising meetings with partners and stakeholders to drive change for midwives globally.

- Get in touch with local women's groups and organise a meeting.
- Involve midwifery students in your midwifery association and political actions.
- Write a letter to your political representative asking for commitments for the next 10 years for midwives.
- Visit your local political representative and tell them about the role of midwives and what changes are needed in your country to improve midwifery services for women and newborns.

ICM will unite midwives and women towards a common goal for gender equality by:

- Engaging women's groups as key stakeholders.
- Harnessing partnership between women and midwives.
- Launching a global campaign to unify women and midwives.

- Contact your local women's groups and tell them about your role and your midwifery association and ask to speak at one of their meetings, or invite them to one of yours.
- Organise a campaign with your local women's group
- Ask the women you care for to use the word 'midwife' in their birth notices and communications.
